This three hour workshop teaches people how to read and apply the 2015 AAMFT Code of Ethics, the Kentucky Revised Statutes, and the Kentucky Administrative Regulations related to MFT. There will be a brief look at the Kentucky Rules of Evidence as well. The workshop will begin with a section related to three different ways of reading ethics codes, all of which create a safe and helpful therapy context when the codes are read in all three ways, with a reading of the codes in only one of these ways leading to a misapplication of the codes. The first reading is "legal ethics," which is a way of reading the codes that only asks, "What must I avoid to stay out of trouble, or what must I do to stay out of trouble?" The second reading is "principle ethics," in which clinicians after understanding what the codes are asking for from a "legal ethics" perspective asks, "What is/are the principle(s) behind this part of the code?" The third reading is "process ethics," in which clinicians ask, "What is/are the process(es) that can be employed in interacting with clients, colleagues, and others so that I might comply with the code, but stay in relationship with others and do no harm?" Case studies are offered along the way and it is intention of the workshop to help participants practice in a more ethical manner.

Training Objectives:

1. Participants will be able to articulate what "legal ethics", "principle ethics", and "process ethics" are.
2. Participants will be able to articulate how only reading ethics codes in one of these three ways will lead to potential ethical challenges for practitioners.
3. Participants through the case studies will demonstrate their proficiency in applying "legal ethics", principle ethics, and "process ethics" in working with client situations.
